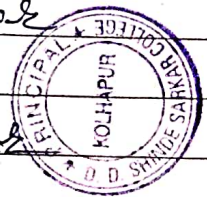


Internal Complaint Committee

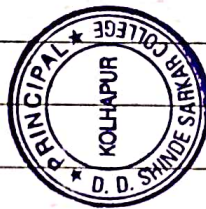

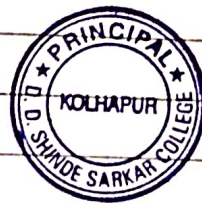

* Anti-Ragging Seminar *

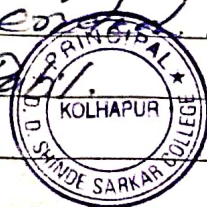

Savitribai Phule – A Versatile Personality

India is a nation which has still adopted and maintained various rituals and traditions. Our nation has united on the basis of various religions and castes. For two centuries our nation was ruled by Britishers and also was divided by them. The British rulers made the perfect use of various castes and religions by making conflicts among the various higher castes and lower – castes which also gave birth to Religious Discrimination. This made more easy for them to reach their goals. This picture was unbearable for the Nation's progress. Therefore various men came forward and raised voice against the British. But many were hanged to death and many were encountered. Whereas the contribution of the women for the nation's freedom is also note worthy. There is still gender discrimination in the society, which has struck the nation like a magnet. Women's participation in India's freedom struggle began over a century before Independence. At the time conservative traditions and social customs had deprived them their rightful place in the society. Among early women fighters to raise banner of revolt was Savitribai Phule.

Savitribai Phule was born in Naigaon (presently in Satara Dist.) in a farmer's family on 3rd January 1831. She was the prominent Indian Social Reformer.

She also was educationist and a very good poet. Savitribai Phule played a very crucial role in women's education and empowerment in the 19th century. She is the first women in India who is regarded for founding the first girls school in Pune, in Bhidewada. She took great efforts towards educating and emancipating child widows. She campaigned against child marriage and Sati Pratha and also advocated for widow remarriage.

She is considered as the role model of Dalit and Mang castes. She worked tremendously for the untouchables and worked actively in abolishing castes and gender based discrimination.

Savitribai married at the age of 9 years to Jyotirao Phule who was 12 years in 1840. Jyotirao was thinker, writer, poet, teacher and a social reformer. He started teaching Savitribai after their marriage. After seeing her eagerness towards education, Jyotirao taught her to read and write. After taking self-education, she started loving teaching and hence she took training at Ms. Fara's institution in Ahmednagar. This made her capable to start her own schools. So with the help of Jyotirao Phule first indigenously running school was started in the year 1848. They were ostracized by both family as well as society. For opening the school. But

Not long ago, the women astronauts were not easy to get. And an Indian woman as an astronaut?

When I looked at the night sky, I realize there have been woman like Kalpana Chawala and others. She was there for over a month travelling over 6.5 billion miles in space and alas! Died there but at least she lived her dreams.

Like a falling star, the 'Columbia Shuttle' plunged downwards on February 1st, 2003. Then many hoped for a miracle – somehow the crew might have survived and Kalpana would return home. Most of those stood upon, the green earth gazing upwards, saw the broken trail of craft as it spread and scattered and rained upon Central Texas.

Kalpana Chawala was born in a small town of Karal, Haryana to a traditional middle class family. She was the youngest of the four children. She studied at the Tagore School but differently from children. Her love for the sky and space began from her childhood. Her school projects and papers were all about stars, planets, and other space. The teachers would find her sketching airplanes instead of playing with her friends. Meanwhile, her businessman father encouraged her to join a 'Flying Club.' He was

horrified when she chose flying as a career. He wanted her to be a 'respectable doctor.' But, Kalpana managed to win her father's resistance and her family's objection. She was the first woman Aeronautical Engineer from the Punjab Engineering College in 1982.

When her father learned that she wanted to go to the U.S.A. for her post graduate studies, he put his foot down. Her parent's wanted her to get married and settle down. Again Kalpana prevailed. In the U.S., She got her postgraduate degree from the University of Texas, Arlington and the doctorate from the University of Colorado. There she met her husband, a French flying instructor and an aviation writer, Jeanpierre Marrison.

In 1988, Kalpana was hired by MCAT Institute, San Jose, California as a Research Scientist to research at NASA Ames Research Center, California. In 1994, she was one of the 19 people selected from 2,963 applicants by NASA, to be an astronaut. Kalpana reported to John Space Center in March 1995.

On November 19, 1997 she became the first person on Indian descent to fly in an American Space Shuttle for 15 days. When she returned, she was mostly overwhelmed by the fact that it took only 90 minutes to circle the planet. “Just 90 minutes even though I has know how small this place is! How fragile it is!” she said.

Her second space mission was widely publicised and plans were made to celebrate on her return. But, the return never happened as the shuttle broke apart

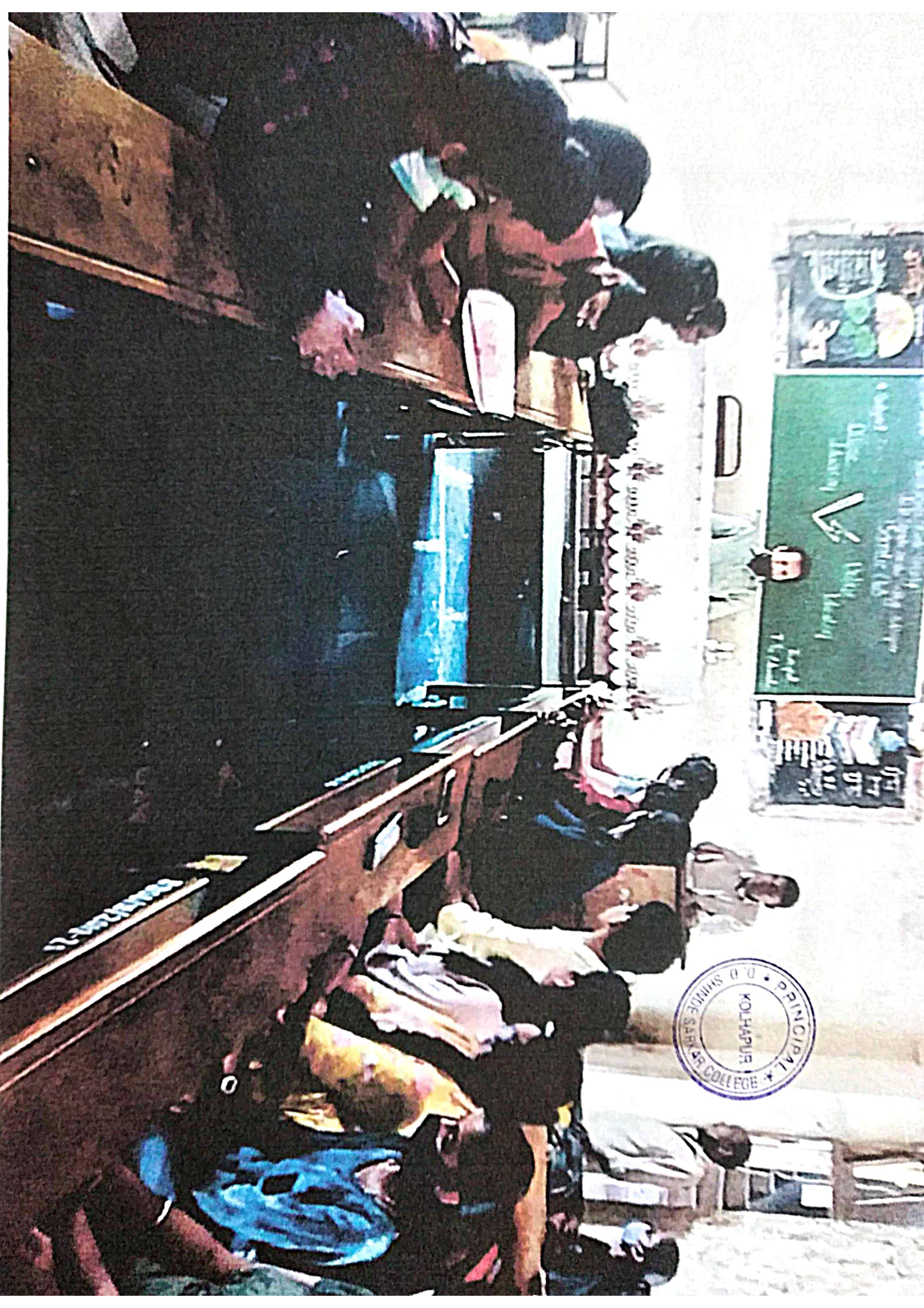
