- 6. The Institution inspired the students to avoid the use of plastic.





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

I SESSION




Mr. Devlapurkar said at the beginning of the lecture that he will try to present what he has learned from experience. Just as medicine is taken quickly after falling ill, it does not happen in the case of the environment. Environmental health being neglected. The population grew but the land did not. Air, water and sky are being polluted on a large scale. Rising temperatures will melt the ice and can drown the entire city. Global warming is causing extreme changes in the climate.

We can beautify the environment with even the smallest things. Instead of expecting the garbage to be picked up by the Gram Panchayat or the Municipal Corporation, it can be used to make compost at home. A cloth bag can be used instead of plastic. With proper vehicle speed control and proper maintenance, air pollution can be reduced.

Mr. Devlapurkar said that the Janswasthya Dakshata Samiti is working against spitting. "I am not a teacher or a professor but an active student," he said. He said that while he was producing fruits and vegetables at home, he could hear the melodious sound of birds.

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
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7.1.2 The Institution has facilities and initiatives for:
